





Emerging Global Leaders Training Program (EGL) Spring 2015 Cohort (March 21-April 30, 2015)

IMPACT Leadership 21 Emerging Global Leaders Training Program arms the next generation of global women leaders through the **IMPACT Leadership 21 Framework and Platform**. The program is designed to inspire, nurture, develop, empower and grow high-potential emerging leaders globally.

The Need:

The 21st century's rapid changes in all cultural, social, and economic spheres across the globe have brought about a need to transform the area of leadership to reflect these shifts. As the leaders have to be able to successfully navigate today's fast-changing, global, and hyper-connected world, there is a need for a new generation of leaders able to set and carry out their visions for tackling current problems and creating an environment of sustainable growth.

Program Description:

The IMPACT EGL Program is predicated around the **IMPACT Leadership 21 Framework**, designed to inspire, nurture, and empower young women and men by fostering in them competencies of a successful leader through the 6 Global Toolkit of Thriving and Succeeding in a Hyper-connected World: I - Innovation, M - Multiculturalism, P - Passion, A - Attunement, C - Collaboration, and T - Tenacity (IMPACT). The program's unique design, which combines classroom instruction with an intensive and interactive discussion component, multicultural immersion, mentoring by industry professionals, and networking opportunities, ensures that each participant gains a maximum of knowledge and experience within a short time frame.



The participants meet in a classroom setting on Saturdays to master through interactive lectures the above mentioned components of the IMPACT Leadership 21 Framework. In addition to these lectures, the participants have the opportunity to expose their gained knowledge and skills through a set of themed development and networking events, specifically, by meeting with accomplished industry professionals and interacting with them on questions of women and global leadership, receiving invaluable mentorship and insights, learning more about these experts' know-how, and getting a feedback on their own progress. These events take place during weekdays, mainly in the afternoon and evening hours.

One of the unique highlights of the program is the rare opportunity for participants to **engage** in dialogues with Ambassadors of the different Permanent Missions to the United Nations. The goal of these dialogues is for participants to find out more about the state of and progress in women's leadership in different countries around the world, and learn of different model practices in women's leadership in a multicultural setting. These dialogues will also highlight the different involvement, projects and initiatives of the United Nations that are making a direct positive impact in these countries in terms of women's advancement and leadership.
